## **COVID UPDATE**

This week saw the introduction of strict fully vaccination requirements for all Department of Education employees and visitors to our school. From this week all visitors and parents who come on site must be fully vaccinated against

COVID-19 and provide evidence of this. They must wear a mask at all times, sign in using the school QR code and be symptom free. New guidelines have been introduced as part of the Department of Education's Term 4 Roadmap. Our school overnight excursions are still not possible, but day excursions are possible for single classes outdoors and for cohorts of students indoors if we have sole use of the facility. This means our Year 5 and 6 end of term events will be able to be held. Presentation Day can be held but must be on site in cohort group with no parents. Year 6 Farewell can go ahead without parents and the Year 6 Graduation can be held with limited fully vaccinated parent participation.
