#### PEDESTRIAN SAFETY



Our school is in a unique situation having three crossing supervisors. Annie on Napier Street, John on Bourke and Kylie on Brisbane Street. I would remind parents that when the crossing supervisors are on duty that the pedestrian under their control should be the preferred position at which you and your child cross the road. There are still too many people running across intersections and crossing at roundabouts at the moment. This is very dangerous and needs to stop. Tamworth Regional Council are proposing to build a safety fence on each corner of the Brisbane/Napier Steet roundabout to assist in keeping our students and parents safe.
